



## **Books and eBooks:**

<u>Baby Owls</u> by Deanna Caswell (E 598.97 CAS): Follow baby owls' first experiences through engaging text, fun facts, and vibrant photography



<u>Owls</u> by Wendy Strobel Dieker (E 598.97 DIE): This search-and-find book invites emergent readers to look for new vocabulary words and pictures while giving simple facts about an owl's body parts and behaviors.




<u>Little Owl's Orange Scarf</u> by Tatyana Feeney (E FEE): Little Owl loves many things. But he does not love his new scarf. It is itchy, too long and too orange. That's why Little Owl is doing his very best to lose his new scarf. Too bad Mommy is so good at finding it.



Wow! Said the Owl: A Book About Colors by Tim Hopgood (E HOP): A curious little owl decides to stay awake to find out how the things he sees at night look during the daytime.




<u>Little Owl Lost</u> by Chris Haughton (E HAU): While his mother is away finding food, a newborn owl falls out of his nest and anxiously tries to find her, receiving help from various forest animals.






<u>Little Hoot</u> by Amy Krouse Rosenthal (E ROS): Little Hoot is an owl who wants to go to bed at a reasonable time like his friends. He gets angry when his parents say owls must stay up late. Also available as eBook.




<u>Little Owl's Day</u> by Divya Srinivasan (E SRI): Little Owl explores the forest at daytime after being woken up by a noisy squirrel.



<u>Little Owl's Night</u> by Divya Srinivasan (E SRI): Little Owl enjoys a lovely night in the forest visiting his friend the raccoon, listening to the frogs croak and the crickets chirp, and watching the fog that hovers overhead. Also available as <u>eBook</u>.



<u>Hoot Owl, Master of Disguise</u> by Sean Taylor (eBook only): Hoot owl flies through the night and assumes numerous disguises in order to catch a meal. Includes an audio read-along!



<u>Owl Babies</u> by Martin Waddel (E WAD): Three owl babies whose mother has gone out in the night try to stay calm while she is gone. Also available as eBook.



<u>Bears New Friend</u> by Karma Wilson (E WIL): Bear and his friends persuade a bashful owl to play with them.



<u>Hooray For Today!</u> by Brian Won (E WON): Owl wakes up and is ready to play, but all his friends are sleeping.



<u>Night Owl</u> by Toni Yuly (E YUL): A baby owl flies through the night, listening carefully to different sounds as he tries to find Mommy Owl.

## **Owls Counting Rhyme:**


Print and cut out the owls and branch below. Say the rhyme, removing one owl each time and count down the owls with your child!

Five little owls sitting in a tree One flew away, how many do you see? One, two, three, four. (count down)


Four little owls sitting in a tree One flew away, how many do you see? One, two, three. (count down)
