



Books and eBooks:




<u>100 Snowmen</u> by Jen Arena (E ARE): As you count and add, watch the snowmen enjoy a snowball fight, make funny faces, play hide-and-seek - and just plain have fun, and you'll have fun, too!



<u>The Snowman</u> by Raymond Briggs (E BRI): When his snowman comes to life, a little boy invites him home and in return is taken on a flight high above the countryside. Also available as eBook.



<u>Snowmen All Year</u> by Caralyn Buehner (E BUE): A child imagines what it would be like if a snowman, made of magical snow, could be a companion throughout the year. Also available as eBook.



<u>Snowmen at Night</u> by Caralyn Buehner (E BUE): A young boy imagines that snowmen play games at night when no one is watching.



<u>An Amazing Snowman</u> by Barbara Jean Hicks (E DIS): Olaf is a snowman who walks, talks, and even dances. But the things that make Olaf special are his caring heart and endless imagination.



<u>Snowballs</u> by Lois Ehlert (E EHL): Pull on your mittens and head outside for a snowball day. Grab some snow and start rolling. With a few found objects-like buttons and fabric and seeds-and a little imagination, you can create a whole family out of snow.




<u>Building a Snowman</u> by Meg Gaertner (E 516.24 GAE): Shares the story of Ellie, who wants to build a snowman. First, she makes a small snowball. Then she rolls the snowball to make it bigger. What happens next?




<u>Mouse's First Snow</u> by Lauren Thompson (E THO): Mouse tries many new things when he and his father go out and play in the snow.



<u>One Snowy Morning</u> by Kevin Tseng (E TSE): A squirrel and a chipmunk spot an odd assortment of objects stuck into a big pile of snow and set out to discover how each can be used.



<u>How to Catch a Snowman</u> by Adam Wallace (<u>eBook</u>): A very clever snowman eludes the traps of the group of children who built him as a contest entry, while gathering items for a surprise.



<u>Sneezy the Snowman</u> by Maureen Wright (E WRI): A snowman who finds it dreadfully cold keeps doing things that cause him to melt, while the children who rebuild him each time offer clothing to keep him warm.

No little snowmen on this sunny day, I'll have to make more on another snowy!















Snowman Maze:
