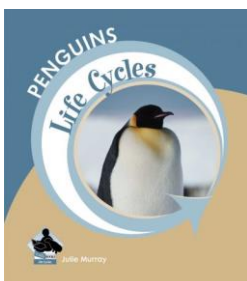
Bye, Penguin by Seou Lee (E LEE): Follow a penguin on a trip around the world after the ice cracks and the penguin is set adrift.



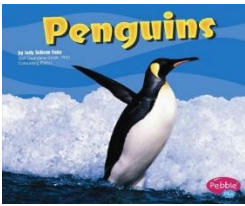

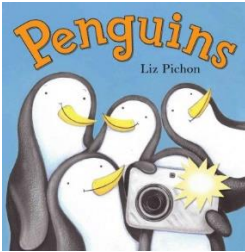

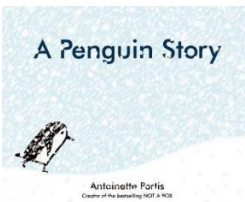
Penguins by Julie Murray (E 598.47 MUR): Presents aspects of the life cycle of different types of penguins, from hatching to reproduction and death.



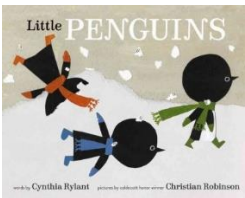
[Penguins](#) by Deborah Nuzzolo (E 598.47 NUZ): Simple text and photographs describe penguins, their body parts, and what they do.



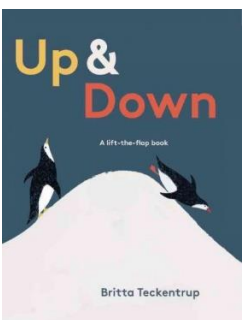
[Penguins](#) by Liz Pichon (E PIC): Penguins at the zoo have an exciting afternoon when one finds a camera left behind by a visitor.



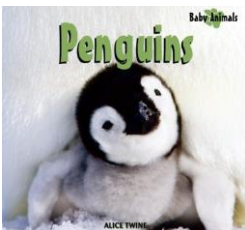
[A Penguin Story](#) by Antoinette Portis (E POR): Edna the penguin tries to find something in her surroundings that is not black, white, or blue.



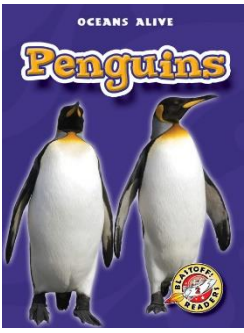
[Little Penguins](#) by Cynthia Rylant (E RYL): During the first snowy day of winter, five little penguins bundle up and venture outside to play



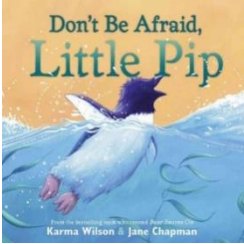

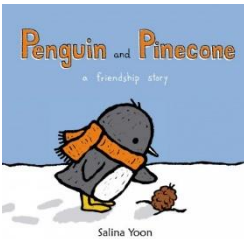
[Penguins](#) by Alice Twine (E 598.47 TWI): Presents information about baby penguins, how they behave, and where they live.



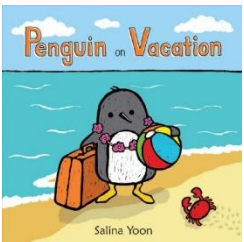
Penguins by Anna Wendorff ([eBook](#)): Beginning readers will discover the physical characteristics of penguins and learn how they move in water and on land.

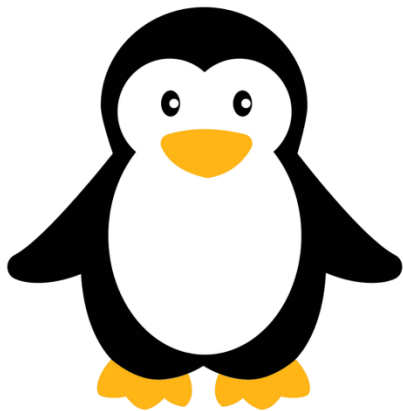
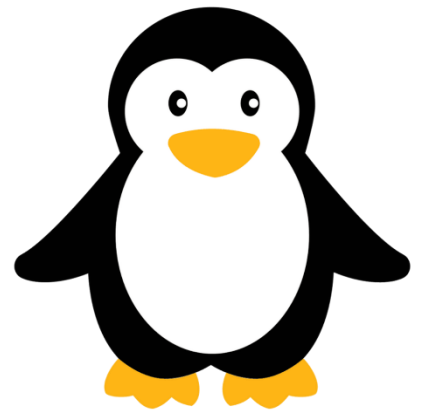
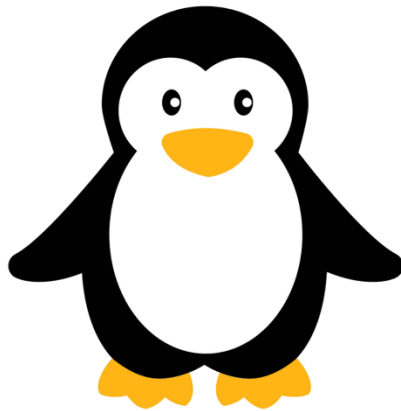
Six little penguins off an iceberg did dive,
One bumped his beak, then there were five.

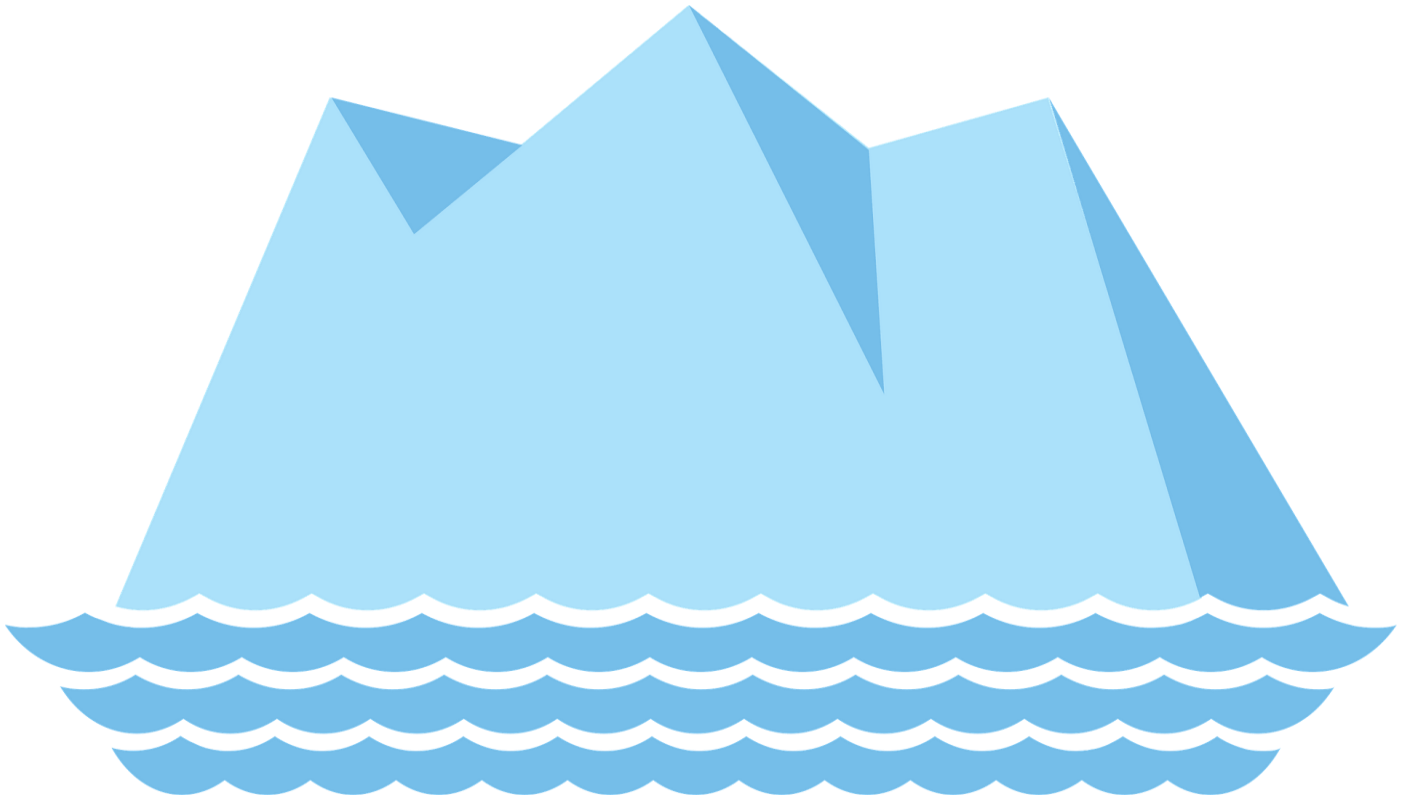
Five little penguins swam the ocean floor,

One fell off, then there was one.

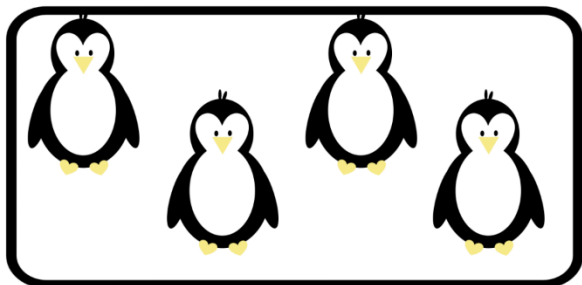
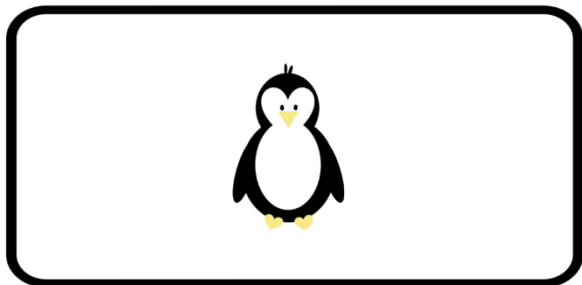
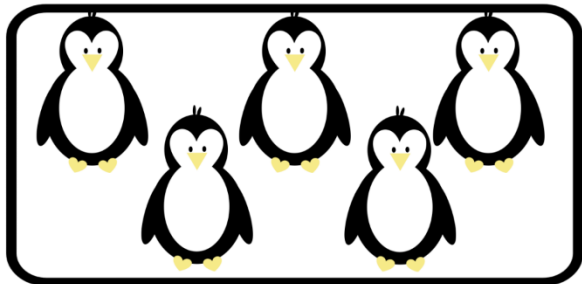
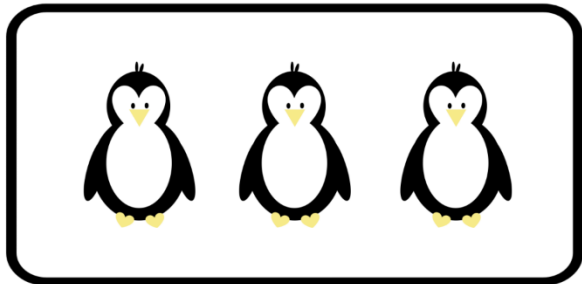
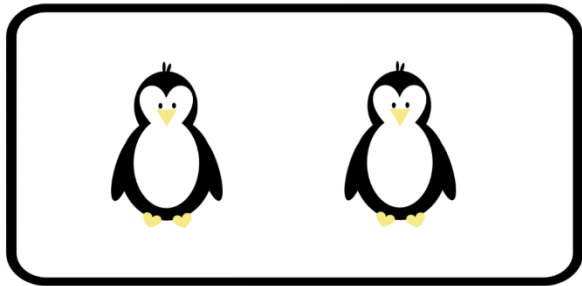

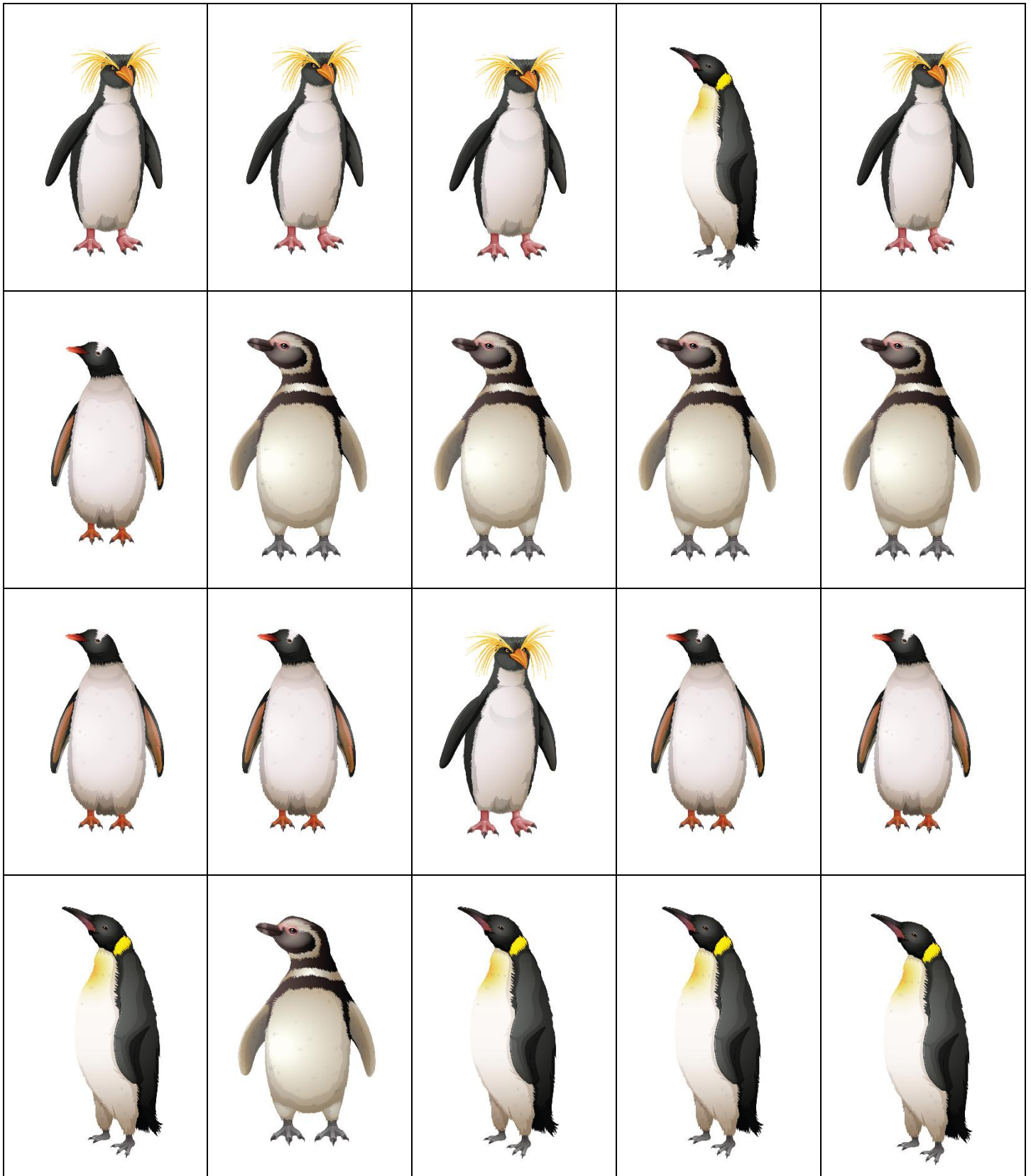
STEAM Activity - Penguin Number Match:
