


Books and eBooks:



<u>Good Day, Good Night</u> by Margaret Wise Brown (E BRO) A little rabbit greets each day and says good night to the familiar things outside.




<u>The Runaway Bunny</u> by Margaret Wise Brown (E BRO) A little rabbit who wants to run away tells his mother how he will escape, but she is always right behind him. Also available as <u>eBook</u> and <u>Audiobook</u>.



<u>A Boy and His Bunny</u> by Sean Bryan (E BRY): One morning, a boy wakes up with a rabbit on his head and, although his mother is skeptical, he soon discovers that he can be fed, ride a bobsled, and even look cool with a rabbit on his head. Also available as eBook.




<u>Black Belt Bunny</u> by Jacky Davis (E DAV): Black Belt Bunny is good at sidekicks, backflips, and air chops, but when told he must learn to make a salad, he resists, only to be unexpectedly empowered by himself and the narrator. Also available as <u>eBook</u>.



<u>Pete the Cat: Five Little Bunnies</u> by Kimberly & James Dean (E DEA): Sing along with Pete the Cat in his cool rendition of the classic kids' song "Five Little Monkeys" with a hippity hoppity twist! Also available as eBook and Audiobook.




<u>Little White Rabbit</u> by Kevin Henkes (E HEN): As he hops along a little rabbit wonders what it would be like to be green as grass, tall as fir trees, hard as rocks, and flutter like butterflies.






<u>Mine!</u> by Susie Lee Jin (E JIN): A humorous picture book about a group of bunnies fighting over a big juicy carrot.



<u>Rabbits</u> by Julie Murray (E MUR): Learn about this favorite common animal while strengthening reading skills and being wowed with great photographs.





<u>Bunnies</u> by Collen Sexton (E 599.32 SEX) Kids will follow bunnies as they leave the nest and go on to watch them grow, eat, and hop. Also available as <u>eBook</u>.




<u>Rabbits</u> by Mari Shuh (E 636.932 SCH) This search-and-find book invites early readers to look for new vocabulary and pictures while giving simple facts about caring for a pet rabbit. Also available as eBook.



<u>Carrot Soup</u> by John Segal (E SEG) After working hard on his garden all spring and summer, Rabbit looks forward to harvest time when he can make soup, but every carrot disappears and Rabbit must find out who has taken them.



<u>Bunny's Book Club</u> by Annie Silvestro (<u>eBook</u>): Bunny loves reading so much that he begins sneaking into the library at night to borrow books, and soon his friends want to join him.



<u>Bunnies on Ice</u> by Johanna Wright (E WRI): A confident and determined young rabbit demonstrates how to be a champion ice-skater.

There was a Little Bunny



Hippity-hop, hippity hay, Five little bunnies went out to play. Hippity-hop, hippity-hay, One little bunny hopped away!


Repeat counting down: four, three, two, one


STEAM Activity:
