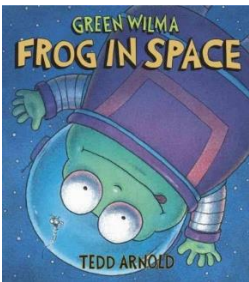


Frogs



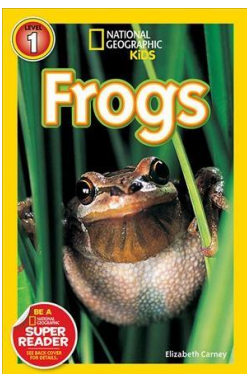
Books and eBooks:

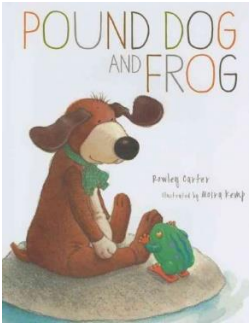
[Stick](#) by Steve Breen (E BRE): An independent young frog goes on a wild adventure when he accidentally gets carried away by a dragonfly.



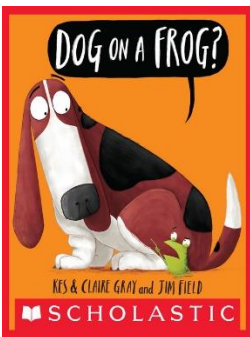

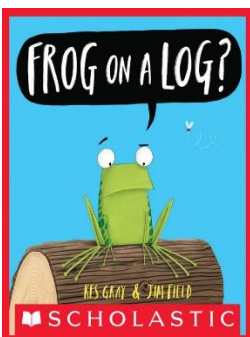
Frogs by Aaron Carr (E 597.89 CAR): Where are frogs born? How many kinds of frogs are there? Young readers will discover these facts and more!



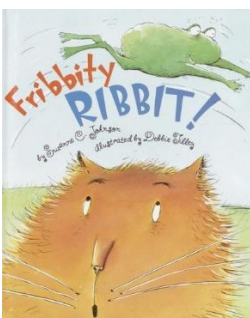

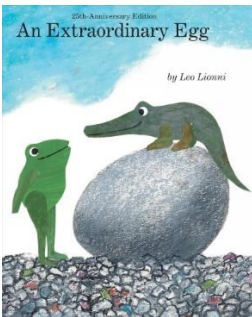
Fribbity Ribbit! by Suzanne C. Johnson (E JOH): A frog on the loose in a house causes havoc and mayhem.



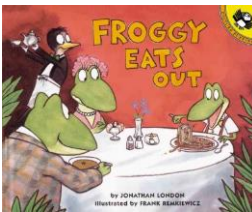

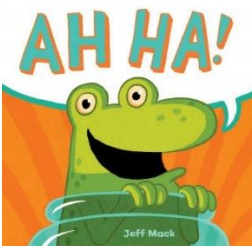
[Excuse Me!](#) by Lisa Kopelke (E KOL): A frog who loves to burp learns the value of good manners.



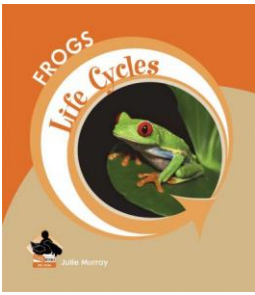

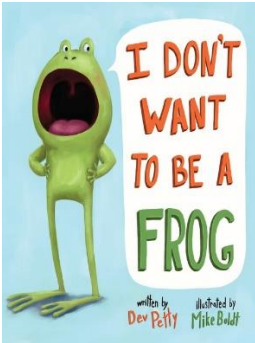

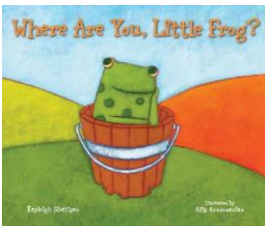

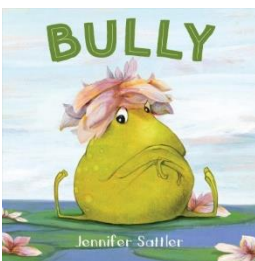
Frogs by Julie Murray (E 597.89 MUR): Illustrations and simple text follow the daily activities of a frog through its life cycle.



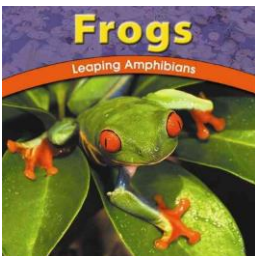

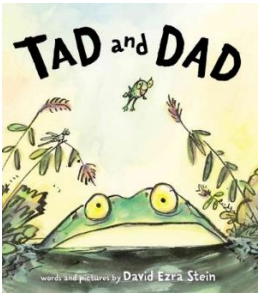

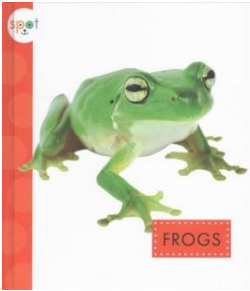
Bully by Jennifer Sattler (E SAT): When a selfish bullfrog takes over a lily pond, the other residents decide to unite and take action.



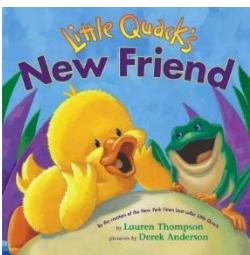

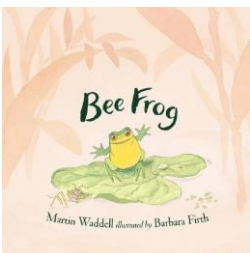

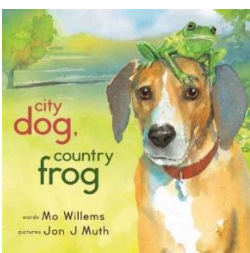

Little Quack's New Friend by Lauren Thompson (E THO): When a frog invites five ducklings to play, four refuse because he is too little and green, but Little Quack has so much fun with his new friend that the other ducklings soon join in. Also available as [eBook](#).



Bee Frog by Martin Waddell (E WAD): It seems that no one pays attention to little Bee, even while she pretends to be a very fierce dragon, so she hops away from home, but soon finds herself wondering if a dragon ever gets lonely.



City Dog, Country Frog by Mo Willems (E WIL): Through the seasons, whenever City Dog visits the country he runs straight for Country Frog's rock to play games with him, but during the winter things change for them both.

Croak Said the Frog

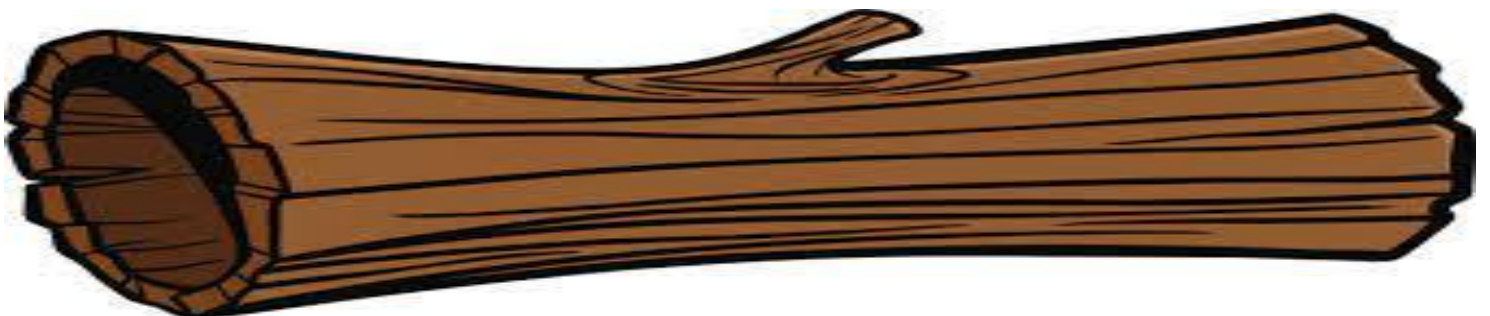
Croak said the frog, (*make croaking sound*)

Glub! Glub! Glub!

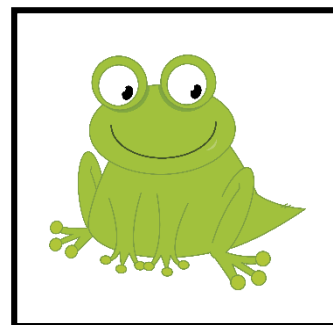
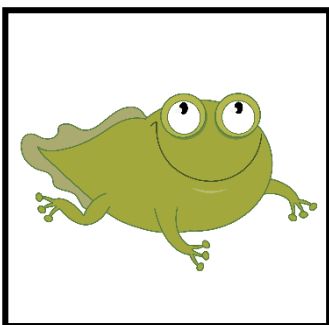
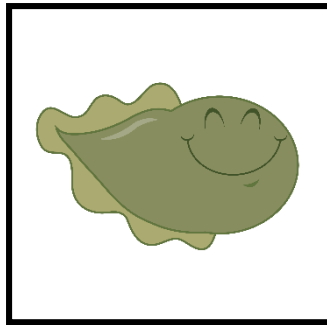
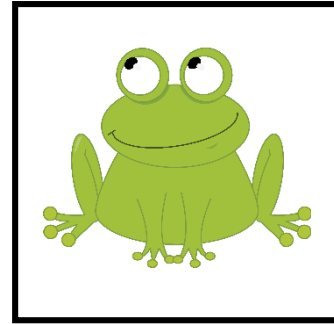
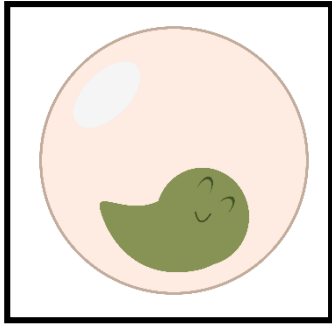
Repeat counting down by one each time.



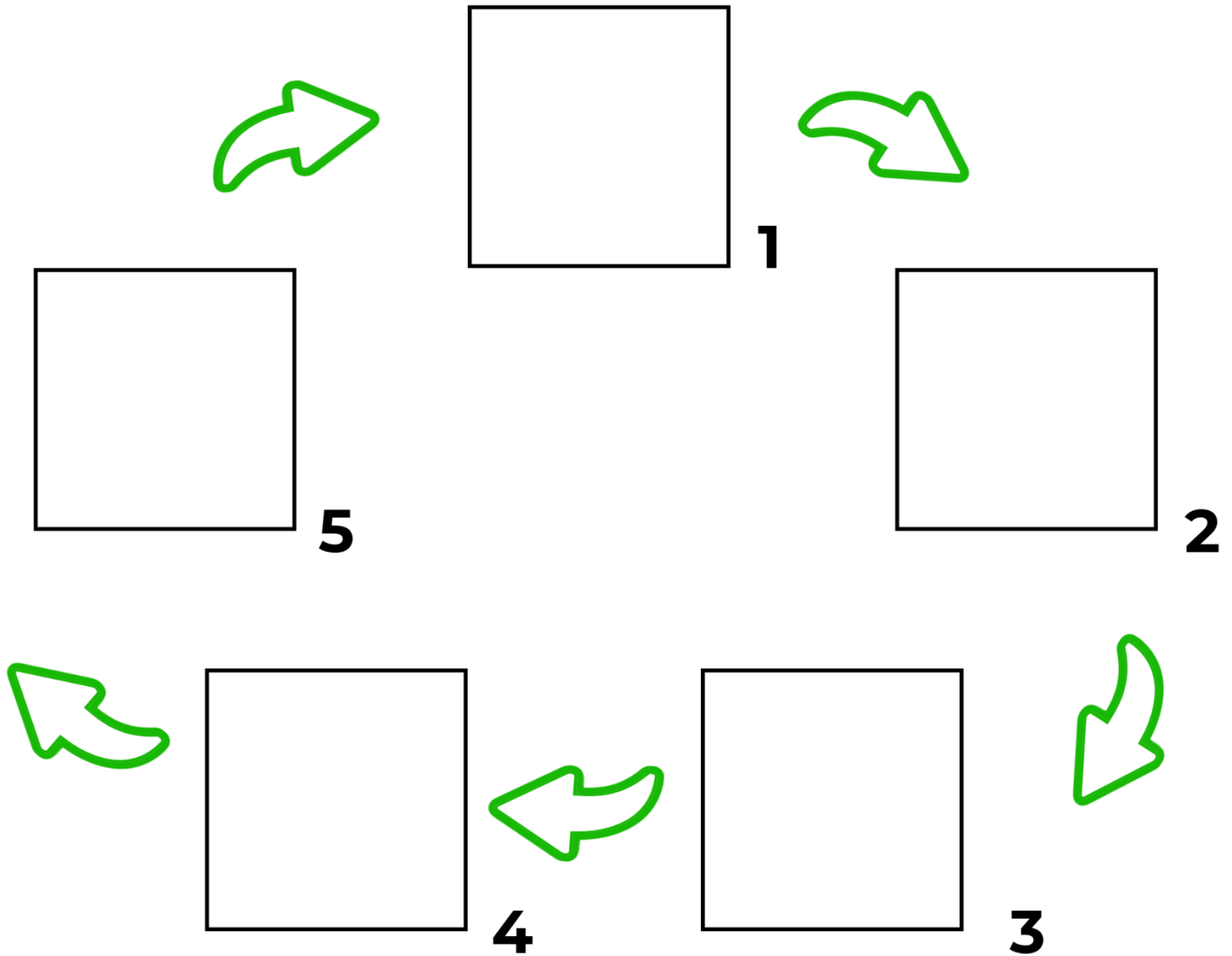


STEAM Activity - Frog Life Cycle:
