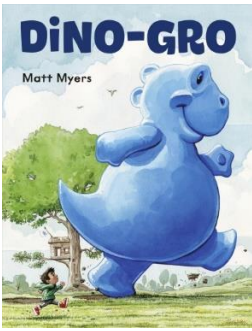
[Dinosaur Dinosaur](#) by Kevin Lewis (E LEW): A rhyming story about a busy day in the life of a young dinosaur.



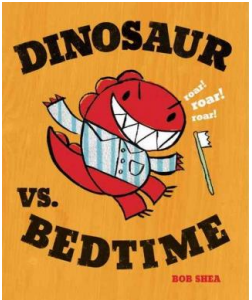

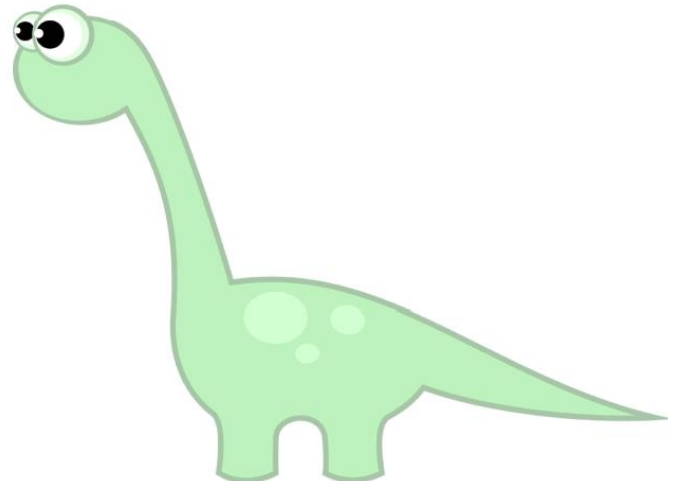
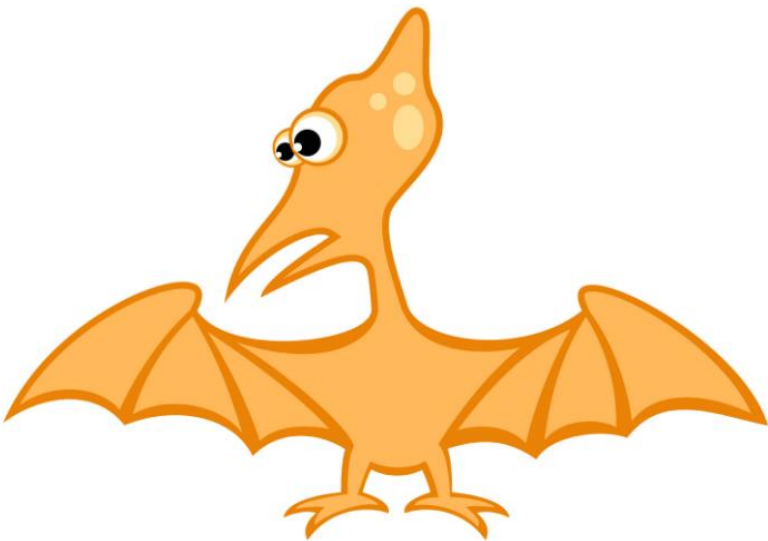
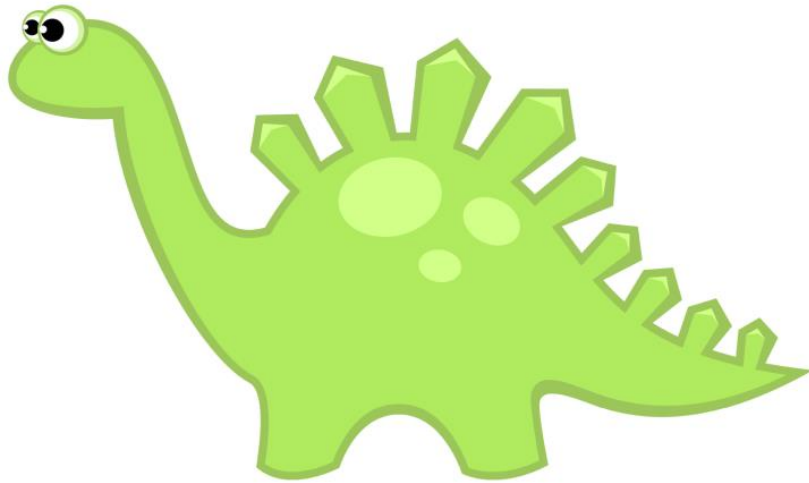
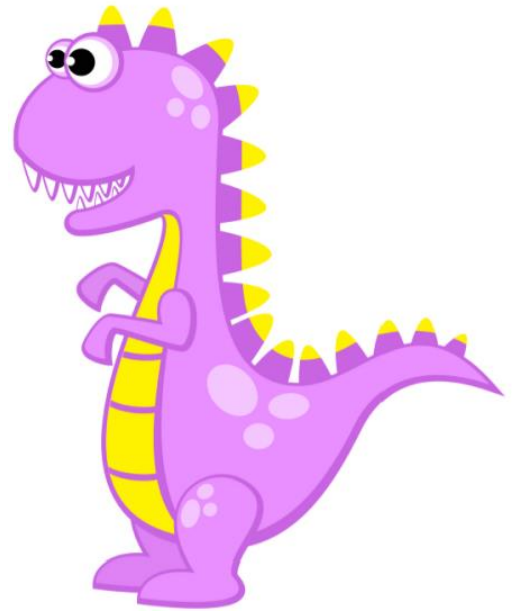
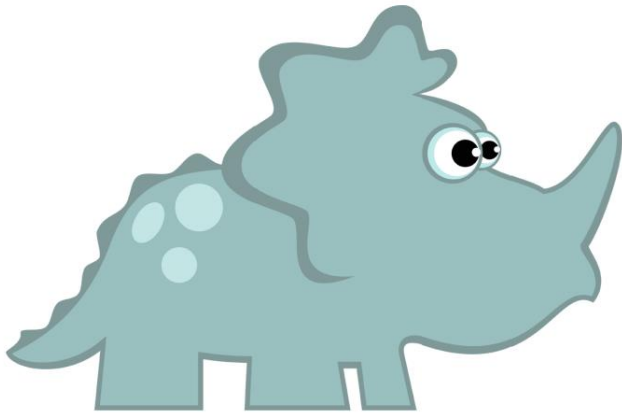
Dinosaur Moves

Just like Tyrannosaurus on the prowl.



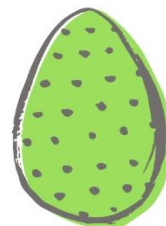
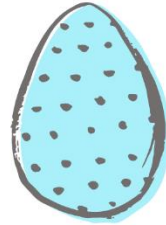
Five Enormous Dinosaurs - Print and cut out the dinosaur images below and use to count down with the rhyme.

One stomped away and then there were none.



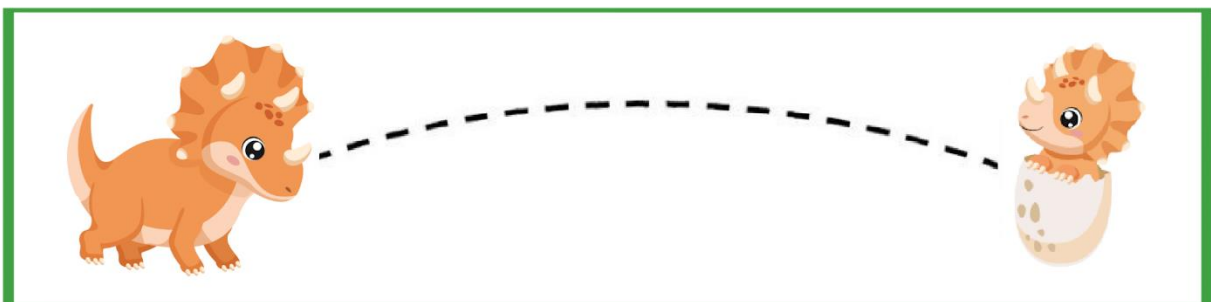
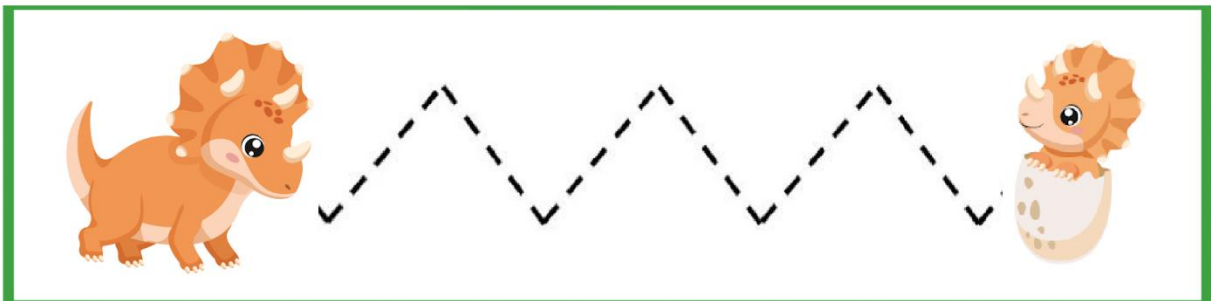
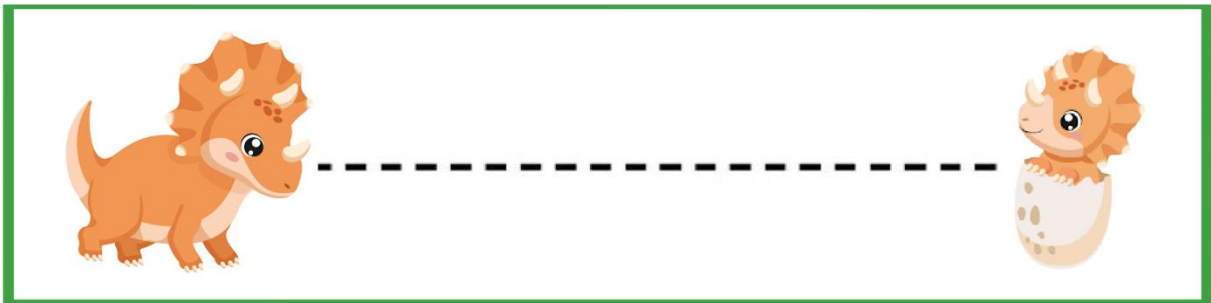
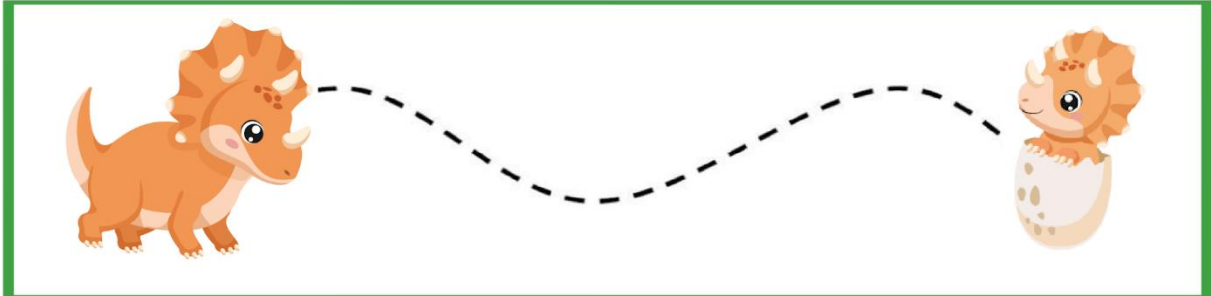
STEAM Activity - Dinosaur Egg Color Matching:
