


Books and eBooks:






<u>Chicks</u> by Kelsey Jopp (E 636.5 JOP): This title introduces readers to the first days, early changes, and growth of chicks. Simple text, straightforward photos, and a photo glossary make this title the perfect primer on baby chickens.




<u>Am I Yours?</u> by Alex Latimer (E LAT): Some friendly dinosaurs must help a lost egg after it's blown out of its nest. But if they are to reunite the little egg with its true parents, they must first discover what kind of dinosaur lies inside. Also available as <u>eBook</u>.




Five Fuzzy Chicks by Diana Murray (<u>eBook</u>): When five baby chicks want to have some fun before bedtime, they visit the other farm animals.



Eggs and Chicks by Fiona Patchett (E 636.5 PAT): Explores the parenting behavior of birds, describing how some birds build nests, how the chicks develop inside the egg, and how the adult bird cares for its young.



<u>Chicks and Salsa</u> by Aaron Reynolds (<u>eBook</u>): Soon after the chickens tire of their feed and decide to make tortilla chips and salsa, all the other animals on Nuthatcher Farm start to crave southwestern cuisine.



<u>Chicks</u> by Anastasia Suen (E 636.5 SUE): This search-and-find book invites early readers to look for new vocabulary words and pictures of baby chickens. Gives simple facts about chicks living on a farm.


Egg & Chick Rhymes and Fingerplays:


Five Little Chicks - Print and cut out the chick images below and use to count down with the rhyme.

Repeat with four, three, two...


One little chick went walking one day, Into the barn and around the hay. Mother hen said "cluck, cluck, cluck, clack", And all five chicks came wandering back!






STEAM Activity - Egg and Chick Color Matching:
