

Books and eBooks:






<u>Fish</u> by Aaron Carr (E 639.37 CAR): This book provides basic information about the care of pet fish.



<u>Dear Fish</u> by Chris Gall (E GAL): One afternoon at the beach, a small boy puts an invitation to the fish to come for a visit in a bottle and throws it into the ocean. The results are ... unusual!



Fidgety Fish by Ruth Galloway (E GAL): Sent out for a swim in the deep sea, Tiddler, a young fish who just can't keep still, sees many interesting creatures and one very dark cave.




The Three Little Fish and the Big Bad Shark by Ken Geist (E GEI): In a spoof of The Three Little Pigs, Jim Fish builds his house of seaweed and Tim Fish builds his house of sand, but Kim Fish smartly sets up house in an old sunken ship to keep the big bad shark from destroying it. 


<u>Fish</u> by Christina Leaf (E 639.34 LEA): This book introduces beginning readers to pet fish through simple, predictable text and related photos.









Five Little Fishes - Print and cut out the fish images below and use to count down with the rhyme.


Five little fishes, swimming in the sea Teasing Mr. Shark, "You can't catch me!" Along came Mr. Shark, As quiet as can be - SNAP!


Repeat with four, three, two, one...

No little fishes swimming in the sea Along came Mr. Shark, As quiet as can be - SNAP! Help! Help! He's chasing me!











STEAM Activity - Fish Puzzle:
