



Books and eBooks:







Butterflies by Aaron Carr (E 595.789 CAR): Introduces readers to the different ways plants and animals go through their life cycles"



Don't Worry Bear by Greg Foley (E FOL): A caterpillar reassures a worried bear that they will see each other again when the caterpillar emerges from its cocoon.



Butterfly, Butterfly by Petr Horacek (E HOR): A little girl sees a beautiful butterfly in the garden one day and while searching for the butterfly the next day she is amazed by all of the other colors in the garden.





<u>Butterflies</u> by Heather Kissock (E 595.789 KIS): Follows a butterfly's development from infancy to adulthood.







<u>Hurry and the Monarch</u> by Antoine O Flatharta (E OFL): Hurry the tortoise befriends a monarch butterfly when she stops in his garden in Wichita Falls, Texas, during her migration from Canada to Mexico.



<u>Gotta Go! Gotta Go!</u> by Sam Swope (E SWO): Although she does not know why or how, a small creepy-crawly bug is certain that she must make her way to Mexico.

Five little butterflies by the door, One flew away and then there were four.


Four little butterflies by the tree, One flew away and then there were three.

Two little butterflies out in the sun, One flew away and then there was one.


One little butterfly now all alone, She was so lonely, she flew home!













Writing Practice - Trace the Lines:
